Bicycle & Wagon Safety

- Patience and courtesy make everyone smile.
- · People and animals have the right of way.
- Please SLOW DOWN. There's no rushing or racing in Fair Harbor.
- Tell children to STOP before they cross Central.
- · Walk your bike in town near stores and Le Dock.
- If you ride at night, you need a light.
- · Pass on the left and say "on your left."
- Razors, skateboards, and motorized scooters are discouraged.
- Keep parked bikes, skateboards and wagons off the walks, especially near the ocean.








Lock your bike at all times.

Bicycle Security

- Bikes are often taken without permission, so LOCK YOUR BIKE on your deck, in front of your house, at the store, and particularly, at the restaurant at night.
- Know the brand name and description of your bike, and its FHCA registration number.
- If you find a bike in the bushes, please alert the owner by calling the number on the bike.
- If the bike has a FHCA sticker, go to fairharbor. org/bikes to find the owner's phone number or bring it to Corliss.
- Please report stolen and found bikes to 911.

DIAL 911

in case of fire, medical or other emergency

Make sure you and everyone in your house knows the name of your walk and house number.

FH Fire Department operates a 24/7, state-of-the-art EMS. Call 911 to alert them.

Doctor's Office - by appointment

Location: 72 Pine, across from the Fire House **Hours:** 11am to noon and 5pm to 6pm, daily including weekends—Memorial to Labor Day **Charges:** Fee schedule is posted on the medical office door. You must pay the doctor by cash or check for each clinic or home visit.

Sirens: One long siren blast is a medical emergency alarm. Three short siren blasts is a fire alarm. The siren is tested daily around noon.

Dogs: All dogs must be on a leash at all times. Please clean up after your dog.

Deer: Keep children away from the deer and please don't feed, pet, chase or scare the deer.

Beach Notes

Lifeguards are on duty every day from late June until Labor Day, starting at 10am until 5pm.

WARNING! The surf's undertow can be very strong. Warn your family and guests to swim with caution.

- · Never swim alone
- · Swim between the green flags
- · Yellow flags mean caution
- Red flags mean extreme caution
- · Crossed red flags mean the ocean is closed
- · Purple flags mean marine life sighted
- · Surf outside of the flagged areas

Lifeguards are not babysitters. Children should be watched by their parents or an adult designated by a parent, both at the ocean and the bay.

- Ball playing, frisbee tossing, smash-ball, etc. are not permitted in the lifeguard areas. Please use common sense and courtesy.
- Volleyball must be played outside the lifeguard's flagged areas.
- · Fill in any big holes you may dig in the sand.
- · Don't leave bikes or wagons on the dune crossings.

In an emergency, call 911

if lifeguards are not on duty. Tell them you need an ocean rescue. Give your name, "Fair Harbor, Fire Island, Town of Islip," the nearest walk, and your phone number. Stay on the line and follow 911's directions.

Please help keep our beach, dock and bayfront clean. Take trash with you.

Safety and Courtesy

- Stay on the boardwalks and away from bushes where deer ticks are found.
- Don't leave your BBQ unattended, and be extra careful on windy days. Clear objects near BBQ.
- Please observe a quiet time between 11pm and 9am, lowering music and voices.
- Please respect the health of others by not smoking cigarettes and cigars on the beach.

Garbage Collection

SECURE YOUR GARBAGE CANS WITH BUNGEE CORDS to prevent a mess from the deer and raccoons.

Daily trash: Garbage is collected on Monday and Thursday mornings. If trash does not fit into a trash can, it must be securely bundled or bagged and tied, and placed near your garbage.

Recycling is placed in tan cans and picked up on Wednesdays. We participate in the WRAP recycling program, recycling cans, bottles, some plastic containers, newspapers and magazines.
